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## Directv dropping comedy central channel

EchoStar Communications, the parent company of DISH Network, said it removed 16 local channels and 10 nationally distributed channels owned by Viacom International Inc. at midnight Monday evening, after talks between the two companies broke down. DISH customers who had previously paid for a package that included the disputed channels will be credited \$1 per month while talks continue. Starting midnight, Dish dropped BET, Comedy Central, MTV, MTV2, MTV Espanol, Nickelodeon, Nick Games & Sports, Noggin, VH1, VH1 Classic and CBS-HD East and West from its network. DISH also stopped broadcasting CBS channels owned by Viacom in Austin, Boston, Baltimore, Chicago, Dallas-Ft. Value, Denver, Detroit, Green Bay, Wis., Miami-Ft. Lauderdale, Minneapolis, Los Angeles, New York, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Salt Lake City and San Francisco. The two sides had waged a public war over the disputed contract. DISH had been leaving the Viacom channels since Jan 7 under the terms of a U.S. District Court temporary restraining order that expired at midnight on Monday. Throughout the past week, Viacom-owned channels began sending scrolling messages on the top or bottom of the screen, urging customers to call dish representatives and ask to keep the channels. In response, DISH reportedly broadcast black bars across scrolling message, hiding it. DISH said Viacom had raised its prices by 40 percent compared to the previous contract, packaging in additional secret channels that the network said would have little or no value to its customers. DISH Network customers in cities with CBS-owned and operated stations have the right to keep up with local news and events distributed across publicly owned airwaves, and Viacom is interfering with this right, Charles Ergen, chairman and chief executive of EchoStar, said in a statement. DISH Network will always have a place for CBS and we are willing to pay for retransmission rights, but Viacom is holding the public airwaves hostage, trying to extract concessions and higher prices on programming unrelated to CBS. Our goal is to remain the best value for our customers at the lowest price, Added Ergen. To do this, we need fair agreements with competitive pricing that allow DISH Network to choose the channels that are most compatible with our customers' interests. Viacom stock (ticker: VIAB) fell more than 7% last week while the company was at risk of failing to reach a deal with DirecTV to keep its 17 channels—like Nickelodeon and MTV—on the satellite TV provider, owned by AT&T (ticker: T). Some analysts thought one would be reached because AT & T could not afford to lose even more Subscribers.
